

## **HAULING REGULATIONS**

**January 4, 1967**

The Granby Board of Health adopted the following regulation effective immediately:

### **Board of Health Requirements**

Under Chapter 111, Section 31A of the General Laws, permits shall be required by the Granby Board of Health for removal or transportation of the contents of privies, cess pools, septic tanks or other offensive systems. Such permits shall be contingent upon compliance with regulation 13.3 and shall expire at the end of the calendar year in which they were issued unless earlier revoked for cause. All work shall be reported to the Board of Health not later than 7 days upon completion.

Under Article II, Section 5.12, Access Manholes. At least one manhole with readily removable cover of durable material shall be provided for each compartment. Inlet and outlet Tees shall be made accessible for cleaning by providing manholes over the Tees or providing clean-out plugs in the septic tank cover. Manholes are required to be brought up to the finished grade, but in no case shall be greater than 12 inches below the finished grade and properly marked for location.

Under Article 11, Section 2.2, Disposal Works Installers Permits. No person or firm shall engage in the construction, alteration, installation or repair of any individual sewage disposal system without first obtaining a Disposal Works Installers Permit from the Board of Health. Such permits shall expire at the end of the calendar year in which they are issued unless earlier revoked for cause by the Board of Health. A copy of each permit issued by the Board of Health under this Article shall be filed with the District Sanitary Engineer of the Department of Public Health.
