

VEHICLES – LEAKAGE REGULATION

The Board of Health of the Town of Granby, acting under the authority of the General Laws and amendments and additions thereto, and by any other power thereto enabling, and acting thereunder in accordance therewith, have, in the interest of and for the preservation of the public health, duly made and adopted the following rule and regulation on February 6, 1984.

All persons storing vehicles on their property shall prevent vehicle fluids from entering the ground or waterways. Undamaged vehicles must not be stored for more than ninety (90) days without taking this action. Vehicles damaged by collision or fire or vehicles suspected of fluid leakage must not be placed on the property at all without taking this action. Body fluids shall be defined as water/antifreeze solutions, brake fluids, engine oil, gasoline or diesel fuel, transmission fluid, differential fluids, or battery acid. Failure to comply with these regulations shall constitute a public health nuisance as defined by the Massachusetts General Law, Chapter 111, Section 122. Allowing these fluids to enter the ground or waterways is a violation of 315 CMR 2.00 Hazardous Waste Regulations.
