CALL TO ORDER: Jim Trompke called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.

Approval of October 17, 2016 Minutes

Jim Trompke asked if there were any changes to the October 17, 2016 minutes. A few changes were made to the minutes.

Motion was made by Jay Joyce and seconded by Robert Sheehan, Jr. to approve the October 17, 2016 minutes as amended. Motion carried 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained.

Hearing

6:05 p.m. Jim Trompke opened the Public Hearing

Cont'd: Consider the application of the Children First Enterprises, Inc., 40 Pleasant Street, Granby, MA for a Site Plan Approval as required under Section 6.3 of the Granby Zoning Bylaw. The applicants propose to expand their existing childcare facility by constructing a new building addition, expanded parking and related site improvements on property located at 38 and 40 Pleasant Street (Assessor's Map 3C-C, Parcels 14 7 17) which is located in the Residential and Mixed Use Development Overlay Districts.

Jeff Squire responded to questions raised by the Board at their previous meeting. Those included

- A construction schedule
 - o The construction schedule is November, 2016 through August 1, 2017
 - O Working Hours will be 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, nothing on Sundays or state recognized holidays
 - o Demolition begins November 2016
 - o They have a demolition permit from town
 - o They have filed with EPA
 - o They plan to have the foundation in before winter, then carpentry through winter months
 - After that they move inside, insulate the buildings, work on windows, start rough on mechanicals in February, with work ending August 1, 2017
 - A construction fence will go up throughout the duration of the project to separate the project from the Children's First.
- A copy of letter from peer review through the Conservation Commission subject to our approval
 - O Mr. Squire received comments from Greg Newman, who is the Peer Reviewer. He replied to Mr. Newman but hasn't received a response back yet. Most of Mr. Newman's questions involved where numbers came from. Mr. Newman wanted to be sure this property was not receiving water from other properties. Mr. Squire left a copy of his response letter to Mr. Newman with the Board. Storm water is also being reviewed. Mr. Squire hopes to have Conservation approval at their meeting tomorrow evening.
- Add a fence for the safety of kids
 - In some form or another there currently is fencing, stockade, chain link, vegetation. A lot is hidden in the brush.
 - O Donna Denette noted as far as she knows the kids the abutters mentioned who were trespassing on their property are not kids from Children's First.
- Parking spaces available year round especially with respect to snow
 - o Mr. Squire has submitted a revised plan. Snow removal will be hauled offsite. All parking spaces will be available.

Questions/comments from the public were as follows:

• Frank Marion – I'm still concerned about the on street parking. Response: We have special events twice a year - Tuesday before Thanksgiving from 11 a.m. to noon and Parents' Night which is the second or third week of September with about 30 cars that come for that night. We try to get as many as we can to carpool, park in parking spaces at Dunkin Donuts or Florence Bank. Also, some residents let people park in their driveways. Police are aware of the events.

Ouestions/comments from Board members were as follows:

- What about a fence around the construction? Response: A full construction fence is planned for the exterior.
- Most noisy work will be during the time most people's windows are closed.
- Are there any wetlands the kids can get into on the property? Response: No.
- Are there any signs on the property? Response: Yes, ground directional signs only.

A motion was made by Robert Sheehan, Jr. and seconded by Jay Joyce to close the public hearing. Motion carried 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained.

6:27 p.m. - Planning Board closed the public input portion of the hearing and then discussed.

A motion was made by Robert Sheehan, Jr. and seconded by Jay Joyce to approve the site plan subject to conditions. Motion carried 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained.

Charges to be billed to Children's First:

- Site plan without special permit \$200 plus .10/sq. ft. estimated 20,00 sq. ft. of area approved
- Public Hearing Notice \$50 plus actual cost of postage to send letters to each abutter
- Actual Cost of Advertisement unless billed directly to applicant by newspaper

Bylaw Changes

The Board discussed possible changes to the bylaws. Those included amending the cost of Site Plan and Special Permits to three tiers:

- \$400 plus \$.10/sq. ft. for small projects
- \$800 plus \$.10/sq. ft. for medium projects
- \$1,200 plus \$.10/sq. ft. for large projects

Determination of sizes for small, medium and large projects will be discussed at a later meeting.

Other bylaw changes discussed were:

- Creating estate lots for developments
- LED lighting
