CALL TO ORDER: Jim Trompke called the meeting to order at 5 p.m.

Approval of September 13, 2021 Minutes

Jim Trompke asked if there were any changes to the September 13, 2021 minutes. Hearing none,

Motion was made by Robert Sheehan, Jr. and seconded by Jason Smigiel to approve the September 13, 2021 minutes as written. Motion carried 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained.

Approval of September 27, 2021 Minutes

Jim Trompke asked if there were any changes to the September 27, 2021 minutes. Nita Abbot should be listed as Absent instead of Other.

Motion was made by Robert Sheehan, Jr. and seconded by Jason Smigiel to approve the September 27, 2021 minutes as amended. Motion carried 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained.

Approval of November 8, 2021 Minutes

Jim Trompke asked if there were any changes to the November 8, 2021 minutes. Robert Sheehan, Jr. noted that as he and Jason Smigiel were not at the meeting and the other two Board members are not present any votes on the minutes should be tabled. Jim Trompke agreed and tabled the minutes to the next meeting.

Approval of November 22, 2021 Minutes

Jim Trompke asked if there were any changes to the November 22, 2021 minutes. Hearing none,

Motion was made by Robert Sheehan, Jr. and seconded by Jason Smigiel to approve the November 22, 2021 minutes as written. Motion carried 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained

Nita Abbott arrived at the meeting at 5:11 p.m.

MVP Grant Progress

Ken Comia updated the Board on the MVP grant that the town is currently working on. He stated that the Board may take up some items, like bylaw amendments, to explore at a future Planning Board meeting.

Another component of the grant will be work on the Master Plan. The Board will be looking at a future update to the Master Plan to incorporate recommendations produced during the Community Resilience Building Workshop in 2019.

5:14 p.m. Motion made by Robert Sheehan, Jr. and seconded by Jason Smigiel to close the regular Planning Board meeting, open the Public Hearing and then reconvene the regular Planning Board meeting. Motion carried 4 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained.

New Business

Allan Beauregard – AJ's Auto Body Site Plan Approval Public Hearing

5:15 p.m. – A public hearing to consider the petition of Allan Beauregard (Applicant) / Daniel D'Arcy (Owner), seeking Site Plan Approval under Section 6.3 of the Granby Zoning Bylaws and applicable of Section III – Regulations, 3.5.8 – Auto Repair Shop- regarding existing business AJ's Auto Body site plan for proposed expansion @ 39 West State Street, and known as Map 3D-C-25 in the town of Granby, MA.

Jason Smigiel read the Public Hearing Notice.

Jim Trompke, reading from Ken Comia's review of the application, noted "the site plan application and preliminary discussion with the applicant states that the proposed expansion and reorganization of the parking lot is to allow for presentation of additional cars for sale."

Allan Beauregard submitted his application to the Selectboard for used car sales with a few more additional parking spaces on the drawing on the far end of the building near Pizza Palace. He was told he needed a Site Plan Approval first.

Jim Trompke noted the original site plan shows 14 parking spaces. The new site plan shows 24 parking spaces. He suggested the issue was extra cars being parked on the end of the building new Pizza Palace. This would require a Site Plan Approval.

Mr. Beauregard remarked in the past some employees have parked on the grass, past the paved parking area.

Jim Trompke said of the Town Department responses DPW did not have any issues, Conservation hasn't responded that he is aware of, the Building Inspector doesn't feel as though it's in his pervue, and the Board of Health takes issue with ground water protection.

Jim Trompke will attend the Board of Health meeting when they discuss AJs Auto Body.

Questions/Comments from the Board:

- Nita Abbott asked if the Board of Health concerns were due to the increase in parking. Mr. Beauregard was unsure as he had not seen the letter.
- Robert Sheehan, Jr. thought we should appease the Board of Health and hear back from them. We also haven't heard from Conservation.

Questions/Comments from the Public:

• George Randall voiced concern that no one from the other departments was there to respond to any questions the Planning Board may have.

Motion made by Robert Sheehan, Jr. and seconded by Nita Abbott to continue the Public Hearing until Monday, December 27, 2021 at 5:15 p.m. Motion carried 4 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstained

Gary Toth Site Plan Approval

5:51 p.m. – A public hearing to consider the petition of Gary Toth (Applicant/Owner), seeking Site Plan Approval under Section 6.3 of the Granby Zoning Bylaws regarding a proposed workshop/storage building, approximately 2,870 square feet, at 81 Pleasant Street, and known as Assessors' Map 3G-1-2 in the town of Granby, MA. The zoning district is General Business.

Jason Smigiel read the Public Hearing Notice.

Gary Toth and Philip Burdick presented a site plan detailing the stormwater management.

Jim Trompke noted the building to be built is larger than the house that was previously on the property. He asked where the extra water would be diverted. Mr. Burdick explained the building will have a pitched roof so half of the water will go to the back of the building where there is green space. The remainder will be taken care of by use of gutters and downspouts and flow into a swale at the lower part of the property. The parking lot will have a slight slope to it and will slope away from the lawn for the first 10-15 feet to the lower area of the swale.

Robert Sheehan, Jr. reminded everyone that the Planning Board sends out the site plans for review to other boards. Mr. Sheehan, Jr. read the response from the the Granby Board of Health. They have "reviewed the Site Plans for the proposed workshop/storage building at 81 Pleasant Street. The Board of Health requests the approval not be granted until submission of type of activity planned, and the plan for ground water protection, water and waste disposal."

Robert Sheehan, Jr. read the response from the Building Inspector. "In reviewing the various submissions for Gary Toth's site plan review the only concern I have is placement on the site to meet zoning setback requirements."

Robert Sheehan, Jr. read the response from the Granby Highway Department, Granby Superintendent. "As requested, the Highway Department has reviewed the plans for the above project. The results of this review and any comments are listed below." Checked off are:

- Potential areas of concerns that should be addressed by the applicant
 - o Drainage
 - Erosion and Sediment Control Plan
