Hampshire Elder Law



HELP provides representation for the civil legal needs of low income elders in Hampshire County. The program appoints attorneys from the Massachusetts Bar to represent senior clients pro bono for estate planning, power of attorney, healthcare proxies, and consumer issues. Anyone Can Report Elder Abuse and Neglect

If you are concerned about a senior citizen, and have reason to believe they are a victim of self-neglect, neglect, abuse, or financial exploitation, please call the Central Intake Unit at 1-800-922-2275. All reports are handled by the local Protective Services Agency which will determine if an investigation is warranted and if so, will investigate the situation and determine a course of action. All calls are confidential.

MA Circuit-breaker Tax Credit TY2023

If you're in the habit of not filing tax returns each year because 'you do not owe' you <u>may</u> be missing out on a state tax credit related to how much property tax on your principal residence (or rent) you pay. The maximum credit is \$2,590. You **must** be a MA resident, 65 years of age by 12/31/2023 and meet an income threshold based on MA total income. If you qualify, then **Schedule CB** is filled out & filed with a MA tax return <u>by</u> 4/17/2024 latest. **Tax appointments are getting scarce at other centers**. Try Community Action's VITA program in Greenfield, Orange, Northampton (low-income requirements). Call 413-376-1136.



Home Modification Loan Program (HMLP)

For towns in Hampshire and Hampden Counties



If someone in the household is an older adult or a person with a disability, you may be eligible.



Loan Information

- Loans up to \$50,000 for property owners and \$30,000 for owners of manufactured or mobile homes
- 0% interest rate
- No monthly payments required
- Repayment is required when the property is sold or transferred

MassHealth Buy-in Program

The MassHealth Buy-in program also known as the Medicare Savings Plan is a federally funded program to help qualified seniors pay for the premium for Medicare Part B, medical deductibles and co-pays, as well as help with the cost of prescription medications. Your Medicare Part B premium is deducted from your Social Security check so your Social Security benefit will increase by \$174.70/month. There are income and asset guidelines to get this benefit.

If you think you would qualify, we have the applications in our office and would be glad to help you apply.


Home Delivered Meals
